Further Information - Proposed 20mph Zone for the Hawkins Road Area

1. The proposed speed limit change will affect the following streets:

Hawkins Road Whole Length
Old Saffron Lane Whole Length
Pentland Close Whole Length
Maris Lane Whole Length

- 2. The estimated cost of the scheme is approximately £4,000, which will be financed by developers rather than the council.
- 3. If this proposal is approved, then the change is likely to come into force in spring 2025.
