OVERDALE SCHOOLS AREA - PROPOSED 20MPH ZONE

Leicester City Council is proposing to introduce a 20mph Zone in the Overdale Schools area. This is part of our commitment to improve road safety and encourage walking and cycling near to schools and in residential areas.

It is proposed to reduce the speed limit on the roads in this area to 20 miles per hour and install traffic calming on Overdale Road and Meadvale Road where speed surveys have recorded speeding issues. No traffic calming is proposed on the other roads in the area. The proposals are shown on the maps enclosed with this letter and further information is available over the page.

Further Information - Proposed 20mph Zone for the Overdale Schools Area

1. The proposed speed limit change will affect the following streets:

Ashclose Avenue Whole Length

Carisbrooke Road From its junction with Shanklin Drive to its junction with Ring Road

Eastcourt Road Whole Length Kingsmead Close Kingsmead Road Whole Length Whole Length Whole Length Northfold Road Whole Length Overdale Road Whole Length

Ring Road From its junction with Carisbrooke Road to its cul-de-sac end

Stockwell Road Whole Length Westgate Road Whole Length

- 2. The proposed speed cushions can be overridden by ambulances, fire tenders and buses. These cushions are manufactured from recycled shredded tyres.
- 3. It is estimated that the cost of the scheme will be around £55,000.
- 4. If this proposal is approved, then the change is likely to come into force in the spring or summer of 2025.
