### **PROPOSED 20MPH ZONE – THURNCOURT NORTH AREA**

Leicester City Council is proposing to introduce a 20mph Zone in the Thurncourt North area. This is part of our commitment to improve road safety and encourage walking and cycling near to schools and in residential areas.

It is proposed to reduce the speed limit on the roads in this area to 20 miles per hour. It is also proposed to install traffic calming on Bowhill Grove because the existing vehicle speeds are currently too high for a 20mph speed limit. The proposals are shown on the maps enclosed with this letter.

The Council would like to hear your views. A response form has been included with this letter so please complete this and return it in the envelope provided by the 10<sup>th</sup> July 2026 (no stamp is required). The responses will be included in a report which will be considered when deciding if the proposed changes should go ahead.
