How could the neighbourhood be improved? What would you prioritise?

- A chance to improve car parking, and loading areas
- Slower traffic speeds, fewer accidents,
- Easier crossing for pedestrians and safer roads for walkers and cyclists
- Revitalised shopping area
- Accessible bus stops
- Landscaping
- Provision for visually impaired pedestrians and those with disabilities
- Bollards for shop security and other street furniture – benches etc.
- Wider pavements to improve the shopping environment
- Removing unnecessary signage and clutter

How could these changes be made?

The idea of 'shared space' has already worked in other cities to widen pavements, manage traffic flow and to make the area safer for traffic and pedestrians alike.
