

Proposed admission arrangements changes at a glance.

Proposed change	Current arrangement
To give priority to previously looked after children who were looked after outside of England	At the moment, this priority is only given to children who are looked after, or were previously looked after, in England
To add a new social and medical criterion	<p>At the moment, priority on exceptional grounds is only given to those who meet the following two domestic violence criterions:</p> <p>Criterion 2: Children who are the subject of child protection plans where an alternative school is necessary to avoid the abuser</p> <p>Criterion 3: Children of parents/carers who are fleeing domestic violence, whose application is verified by a senior social worker or who meet Leicester City Council's procedures for housing reallocation for recognized domestic violence</p> <p>It is proposed that these criteria are removed and replaced with the social and medical criterion, to ensure that the most vulnerable children are given priority for a place where there are compelling reasons to attend a specific school</p>
To extend sibling priority to include siblings in attendance in Year 11	At the moment sibling priority extends to siblings in attendance up to year 10 only
To add a new criterion which gives priority to children of staff	This is a new proposed criterion which will sit below the criterion for children living in the catchment area
To amend the admission arrangements relating to Fosse Primary and Slater Primary – if the proposal to bring the two schools together from September 2019 is implemented	This is subject to a separate consultation which closes on 28 January 2017. If this proposal is approved, it will mean that both schools join to become one and have a higher admission number of 120 in 2019
